## Fixtures and Fittings

Changes to the club and surroundings began in February.

The first change for 2021 was the barrier erected at the entrance to the car park and clearance of the trees and shrubs to the right of the path alongside the Community Centre.

This work was done by Fareham Borough Council to hopefully stop vehicles over two metres in height, gaining access to the car park and adjoining playing field. It will hopefully prevent any traveller issues from occurring in the future. The clearing of trees and shrubs has made the approach to the club much more pleasing to the eye.

Well done to all members who entered the competitions and a special thank you to Rod Maxted for his hard work in organising and running the competitions.

### **Southampton and District Men's Leagues.**

The Men had a pretty good year on their return to their respective Leagues. All the Men's Leagues were able to start their League Season at the beginning of May albeit with a few restrictions to begin with.

The Championship Team had the number of rinks reduced from four rinks to three and finished in third position in Division Two.

The Combination Fours Finished fourth in their Division Two League.

The Combination Triples had a very good season and finished Runners – Up to Banister Park "C" in Division One.

The Men's season ran as normal and they completed their matches by the middle of August.

### **Southampton and District Ladies' Leagues**

The Ladies Leagues this year started later than usual, due to some clubs not knowing if they could field teams or accommodate fixtures.

However, after a last minute rearrangement of teams from different clubs the Lockwood 1 Rink Team in Division "A" finally started at end of May and ran until the end of August.

Lockwood 2 Rinks Team in Division "B" had a short season starting at the beginning of June and running to the end of August.

Lockwood 1 had an unsettled season with players out for various reasons so the teams were not consistent. They finished 6<sup>th</sup> in the league just above Hyde Abbey.

Lockwood 2 fared better and with more consistent teams finished in third place.

There was no promotion or relegation for the ladies this year, so hopefully our teams will all be safe in their respective leagues for next year.

### **The Gosport and Fareham leagues.**

There was a delay in the arranging of these leagues this year as the district had concerns about the safety of players under the restrictions before the 21<sup>st</sup> June.

Eventually, however, it was decided that the league matches would be played as friendly matches after the 21<sup>st</sup> June when the Covid restrictions were finally lifted.

Only half of the fixtures for this season were played but whilst it was played on a friendly basis, points were awarded. There was some difficulty for the captains of teams this year fielding teams but despite this Lockwood Gold and Lockwood Red finished 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> positions respectively in Division 1.

The Lockwood Green Team finished unfortunately in last place.

The Lockwood Silver Team were the most successful team this year season finishing in third position.

There were no Gosport and Fareham Competitions contested this year. Let's hope they will be back next year.

### **The Castle Cup**

The Castle Cup resumed this year with Lockwood's turn to visit Portchester to compete for the Castle Cup.

On what was probably the hottest day of 2021, four rinks of pairs took to the rinks for a timed session from 1pm – 3pm and four rinks of triples played from 3.15pm – 5.15pm.

It was a very friendly occasion, but unfortunately whilst the scores were close, Lockwood only managed to win on one rink of pairs and one rink of triples. So, the castle Cup was won this year by Portchester.

Hopefully, Lockwood will win it next year when Portchester come to us.
